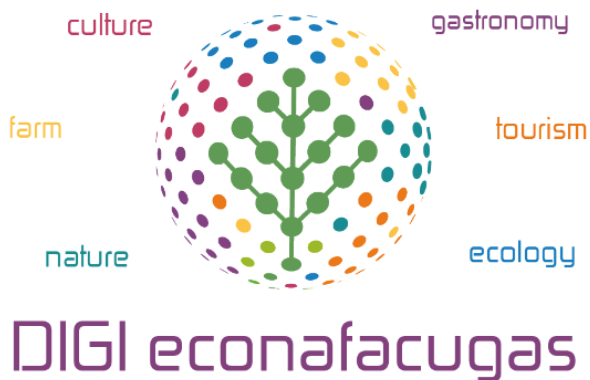

# European Collaboration advances digitalization and sustainable practices in rural tourism through Erasmus+ DIGI ECONAFACUGAS Project

The Erasmus+ DIGI ECONAFACUGAS project, a collaborative effort between five environmental NGOs from Spain, Slovakia, Romania, and Austria, is proud to announce the successful completion of its mission, co-funded by the Erasmus+ program of the European Union (KA2 – Cooperation among Organizations and Institutions). The project aimed to promote digitalization in rural tourism and develop sustainable practices in the management of natural and agricultural resources.

Between 2023 and 2024, the project organized two key workshops in Romania and Spain. These workshops brought together experts in nature conservation, agriculture, and tourism to exchange knowledge and develop innovative approaches to rural development. The insights and

outcomes from these workshops have been compiled into a comprehensive Best Practices Guide, which highlights existing digital tools and provides concrete examples of successful strategies in these fields.

The Best Practices Guide developed under the DIGI ECONAFACUGAS project seeks to enhance understanding and application of digitalization in rural tourism. It aims to contribute to population retention in rural areas and promote the sustainable management of agricultural, forestry, and livestock activities. The guide also includes a network of digital tool developers and showcases successful initiatives that can serve as models for other regions.
